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This report presents the County and Division Profiles for Kampala Capital City based on the National Population and Housing Census 2024 undertaken by the Uganda Bureau of Statistics (UBOS).

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FOREWORD



The National Population and Housing Census (NPHC) is the main source of demographic, environmental, and socio-economic data and statistical information used for planning, policy formulation, and evidence-based decision-making. Uganda has conducted 6 Population and Housing Censuses since independence, at approximately 10-year intervals, with the latest census being in May 2024. The NPHC 2024 was undertaken under the theme 'It matters to be counted'.

The National Population and Housing Census 2024 Final Report – Volume 1 was published on 31st December 2024. The report provided insights into the country's population size, population distribution by age group disaggregated by sex, and population up to the district/city level. Other information included the characteristics of the population, the dwellings they live in, and the household-based Agricultural activities.

The County/Division and Subcounty/Town Council Reports present the final results of the population, household characteristics and housing conditions at Parish/WARD level for 17 Sub Regions. The concepts and definitions used in the Final National Population and Housing Census 2024 Report – Volume 1 remain the same in these reports. These reports are uploaded to the UBOS website (www.ubos.org).

The Bureau is grateful to the Government of Uganda for the continued financial support. We are also indebted to the Private Sector, Academia, Media and Development Partners for their cooperation and support towards a successful Census and production of these reports.

The Bureau appeals to decision makers, researchers and academicians to make extensive use of this statistical information for planning, policy analysis, evidence- based decision-making and public debates.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

- a) **Special Age groups** are defined as follows.

 - Children Under-5; 0-4 years
 - Children; 0-17 years
 - Primary school-age children; 6-12 years
 - Secondary school-age; 13-18 years
 - Adults; 18 years and above
 - Older persons eligible for SAGE; 80 years and above
 - Age group
 - i. Working-age population 15 years and above 14-64 years
 - ii. Youth 15–24 years 18–30 years
 - iii. Older persons 65 years and above 60 years and above.

b) **Health Insurance** policy is an agreement between the insured and insurance company in which the company agrees to cover the cost of certain listed medical benefits such as testing, drugs, and treatment services.

c) **Mental health disorder** (general psychological distress) is a psychiatric condition characterized by disturbances in cognition, emotion, or behavior, leading to distress or disability in important areas of life such as socializing, work, or self-care.

 - **Probable anxiety disorder:** The likelihood of someone being anxious i.e., normally feels worried, nervous or anxious.
 - **Probable depressive disorder:** Losing interest in pleasurable activities and having low feelings, sadness and stress.
 - **Probable psychosis:** Seeing things that others don't see or hearing voices that others don't hear
 - **Probable bipolar affective disorder:** Having extreme emotions and mood swings
 - **Probable Suicidality:** The experience of suicidal plans, thoughts or attempts

d) **Unemployment rate** is the proportion of the unemployed population to the total Labour force. According to the 19th International Conference of Labour Statistics (ICLS) of the ILO, a person is considered unemployed if they; a) Had no work from which they derive some income, b) Had taken active steps to look for employment and c) Were willing to be employed if an employment opportunity had presented itself.


e) **Youth Not in Employment, Education, or Training** (NEET) refers to those youth who are not engaged in any form of employment, formal education, or vocational training.

f) **Improved drinking water sources** are those that, by nature of its construction or through active intervention, is likely to be protected from outside contamination (UNICEF). Improved water sources to include: piped water, boreholes, protected springs, and rainwater.

g) **Unimproved drinking water** may be contaminated with human or animal faeces containing pathogens, or with chemical and physical contaminants with harmful effects on child health and development. Unimproved drinking water sources included unprotected well/spring, vendor, tanker truck, bottled water and river/lake.

- h) ***Improved sanitation*** is defined as an improved toilet facility that is not shared with any other household. Improved' sanitation facilities are those designed to hygienically separate human excreta from human contact. These include wet sanitation technologies such as flush and pour flush toilets connected to sewers, septic tanks or pit latrines, sanitation technologies such as dry pit latrines with slabs, ventilated improved pit latrines and composting toilets
- i) ***Subsistence Economy*** refers to a system where households produce goods primarily for their own consumption, with minimal or no surplus for sale or trade. Households within the subsistence economy are those unable to satisfy their basic needs. Essential household requirements encompass both food and non-food items.

INTRODUCTION

1.1 General Information about Uganda

Location and Size

Uganda is located in East Africa and lies across the equator, about 800 kilometers inland from the Indian Ocean. It lies between 10° 29' South and 40° 12' North latitude, 29° 34' East and 35° 0' East longitude. The country is landlocked, bordered by Kenya in the East; South Sudan in the North; Democratic Republic of Congo in the West; Tanzania in the South; and Rwanda in South West. It has a total land area of 241,553 square kilometers.


Administration


Figure 1.1: Map of Uganda showing Population Distribution by Sub Region

At the time the NPHC 2024 was conducted, Uganda was divided administratively into 135 districts and 11 cities. The Census analysis is based on the 17 Sub Region groupings as classified in the First Schedule of the 1995 Constitution of the Republic of Uganda (Figure 1.1). The role of these Local Governments is to implement and monitor Government programmes at the respective levels. Over time, the administrative units have been sub-divided with the aim of easing administration and improving the delivery of services. The numbers of administrative units on the various census nights since 1969 are given in Table 1.1.

1.2 About the National Population and Housing Census 2024

The main objective of the NPHC 2024 was to generate bench-mark statistical data to inform planning processes at national and lower levels. The specific objectives were:

- i) To ascertain size, structure and distribution of the population
- ii) To gather data on housing conditions and access to basic services
- iii) To monitor changes in key social and economic indicators since the previous Census
- iv) To update census maps and lists of Enumeration Areas for effective execution of the census, construction of efficient area sampling frames for subsequent surveys and geographical maps at the lowest level.
- v) To establish the statistical infrastructure for future operations at the lowest Local Government level.
- vi) To further enhance the capacity of UBOS staff to undertake future censuses and large-scale sample surveys.
- vii) Inform policies and programmes aimed at improving the quality of life of all Ugandans.

Pre-Census Enumeration

- i) The Bureau conducted countrywide geo-referenced mapping of households between June 2022 and April 2024 in preparation for Census enumeration. Mopping up of the geo-mapping to include villages missing
- ii) In the geography by Census time continued during the Census period, which enabled the entire country to be geo-mapped, yielding a total of 10,806,982 households. Census mapping resulted in delineation of
- iii) Administrative boundaries into manageable units called Enumeration Areas.
- iv) Development of the Census instruments through a highly consultative process with stakeholders before the Census enumeration to discuss user needs regarding the Census topics. The results of the consultations aided in revising the Census questionnaires, which yielded 178 questions.
- v) Establishment of the Information, Communication and Technology Infrastructure to support Census implementation and other post-Census statistical undertakings in the National Statistical System.
- vi) Publicity and advocacy for the National Population and Housing Census 2024. The Census Office organised a communication and advocacy campaign to create public awareness and knowledge that facilitated countrywide grass-roots participation in the NPHC 2024.

- vii) Procurement of Census materials and logistics and delivering them in all Local Governments.
- viii) Preparing (provisioning) and deploying electronic equipment in preparation for training and data collection.
- ix) Recruitment and training of Census Enumerators and Supervisors.
- x) Deployment of Census materials and field staff to their responsibility areas.
- xi) Intensive publicity and advocacy to create awareness about Census activities.

Census Enumeration

- i) Listing of all households before the main enumeration.
- ii) Complete count of all households and the entire population, including floating population, hotel population, refugee population, institutional population and persons in transit.
- iii) Collection of individual, household and community characteristics. All the data collected from the field by enumerators was sent from the tablets directly to UBOS hyperconverged servers, which are housed in the NITA (U) space at Statistics House in a tamper-proof environment. During data collection, the external connection, mainly to the Android tablets used by enumerators, passed through a robust firewall that ensured only the appropriate and secure data exchange occurred. Raw data from the field was transmitted to the servers in real time and there was a dashboard on which data transmission was being monitored.
- iv) Real-time uploading of data to the central server for processing.
- v) The entire data transfer process was automated, minimizing the risk of unintentional or intentional human errors. Hence, the system is robust and secure for handling Census data.
- vi) All the NPHC 2024 data is safely backed up at a Disaster Recovery Centre located at a secure NITA (U) space.
- vii) Technical staff access data from various workstations connected to the servers through Stata version 18.0 software installed on the servers. These workstations leverage the computing power of the server and are secured through sophisticated authentication measures to restrict access to only authorized personnel of UBOS.
- viii) Retrieval and replacement of all ICT equipment that may malfunction during enumeration.
- ix) Publicity and advocacy for the National Population and Housing Census 2024.

Post-Census Enumeration

- i) The Post-Enumeration Survey (PES), which was successfully conducted in August 2024, by independent experts, to validate the content and coverage of the Census enumeration. The PES established an undercount of 4.3%, translating into 1,973,933 persons not counted. These will be incorporated in the population projections going forward.
- ii) Retrieval of the tablets and other Census materials.
- iii) Census data processing and analysis were done from the processing servers and files saved on separate folders on the storage server within the hyperconverged environment.
- iv) Release of preliminary estimates of population counts at district level. His Excellency the President launched the Preliminary Report on 27th June 2024. The report provided initial insights into the country's population size, population distribution by age group disaggregated by sex, and population up to district/city level.
- v) Release of provisional results by socio-economic characteristics at district level. On 3rd October 2024, the Provisional Report with more details on demographic and socio-economic data was launched by the Rt. Honourable Prime Minister.
- vi) Release of the final report on 31st December 2024.
- vii) Dissemination of subject-specific thematic Census reports, policy briefs and area maps, among others, by June 2025.

1.3 The Census 2024 Final Results

The total population of Uganda was 45,905,417 persons with an average annual growth rate of 2.9 percent as shown in Table 1.2. More findings from the Census can be found in the NPHC 2024 Final Report – Volume 1 (Main) on the UBOS website (<https://www.ubos.org>)




